Please read with your child, discuss the book with them and ensure they answer the questions which relate to the book. Please encourage your child to keep them safe and learn them every week.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Times Tables</u></p> <p>Your child has their own individual login for the free Times Tables Rock Stars app. This can be downloaded as an app or accessed through a web browser. The times tables that your child needs to learn are already set for them to practise. Please encourage your child to use Times Tables Rock Stars regularly, eg. at least 3 times a week. We will complete times tables assessments in class at the end of each week and also monitor their progress using the app.</p> <p>Please ask them to use the Garage area to help them to learn the spellings and the studio if they want to challenge themselves up to 12 x 12. https://trockstars.com/login</p>
